Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: Fidelity Dividend Multi-Asset Base Fund (Fund) aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity securities of companies that pay dividends or are expected to pay dividends.

The Fund may also invest in other types of securities that are expected to distribute income, such as preferred shares, fixed income securities and equity securities that are not expected to distribute income.

Strategies: The portfolio management team focuses primarily on a company's financial stability, potential to generate sustainable return on equity over time, and current valuation when deciding whether to invest in the company. When buying and selling equity securities for the Fund, the portfolio management team may examine each company's potential for success based on its current financial condition and industry position, as well as economic and market conditions. The portfolio management team invests in companies deemed to be undervalued in the marketplace in relation to factors such as the company's assets, sales, earnings, growth potential, cash flow or when being compared to other companies in the same industry. They may consider factors like balance sheet strength, earnings estimates, ability to pay dividends, and quality of management.

The Fund may invest in Canadian or foreign equity securities of companies of any size. The Fund may invest up to approximately 49% of its net assets in foreign securities. The Fund may hold cash and may invest in fixed income securities of any quality or term.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in this Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. Any changes to the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund is suitable for medium- to long-term investors who want to seek the potential for both income and capital gains, and can handle the volatility of returns generally associated with equity investments. The Fund is not an appropriate investment for investors with a short-term investment horizon. To invest in the Fund, investors should be willing to accept a medium level of risk. The suitability of the investment has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

Securities of this Fund are only available for purchase by other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity, and are not available for public purchase.

Fidelity Dividend Multi-Asset Base Fund, Series O, returned 12.5%, for the year ended June 30, 2024. During the review period, Canadian Equities, as represented by the S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index, returned 12.1% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

Canadian equities, as measured by the S&P/TSX Composite Index, returned 12.1%, for the one-year period ended June 30, 2024.

Canadian equities advanced for the period under review. Increases in cyclically sensitive sectors, such as energy and materials, were driven by rising oil and commodity prices. Financials also rose, supported by the general health of the Canadian banking sector. However, there were modest signs of stress among smaller businesses and households due to high leverage and the impact of prior rate hikes. In contrast, the communication services and real estate sectors faced headwinds, particularly towards the end of the review period. These sectors were pressured by higher interest rates and a shift in consumer spending patterns. A stable domestic economic environment, resilient growth in the U.S. economy, combined with a general trend towards lower inflation supported investor sentiment. The annual inflation rate fell to 2.7% in April 2024 from 2.9% in March 2024, due to slower growth of food prices. Despite an increase in the unemployment rate to 6.2% in May 2024, job creation surpassed expectations, indicating underlying economic resilience. The Bank of Canada (BoC) forecasts GDP growth of 1.5% in 2024 and 2.2% in 2025. Based on this outlook, the BoC lowered its policy rate by 25-basis points to 4.75% in June 2024, the first rate cut in four years and signalled a shift towards more accommodative monetary policy as inflation pressures moderated.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the S&P/TSX Composite Dividend Index, returned 12.4% for the review period. The Fund outperformed its benchmark primarily due to investments in, and higher-than-benchmark exposure to, the information technology sector. In the sector, investments in U.S.-based multinational technology firm Microsoft, and U.S.-based software-connected automated test and measurement systems provider National Instruments, contributed to relative returns. In addition, lower-than-benchmark exposure to the materials sector contributed to relative returns. In this sector, lower-than-benchmark exposure to Canada-based mining and metals firm First Quantum Minerals, and lack of exposure to a Canada-based precious metals producer, both contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, investments in Canada-based insurance firm Fairfax Financial, Canada-based oil and gas exploration and production firm Canadian Natural Resources, and Canada-based engineering firm AtkinsRéalis Group, all contributed to relative returns.

In contrast, investments in certain stocks in the health care sector detracted from relative returns. In the sector, an investment in U.S.-based medical technology company Becton, Dickinson and Company detracted from relative returns. In addition, lower-than-benchmark exposure to the energy sector detracted from relative returns. In that sector, lower-than-benchmark exposure to Canada-based integrated energy firm Suncor Energy detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, lower-than-benchmark exposure to Canada-based financial services firm Brookfield Corporation, and investments in Canada-based telecommunications firm Rogers Communications, both detracted from relative returns.

At the end of the review period, the Fund had no exposure to National Instruments, First Quantum Minerals, and Becton, Dickinson and Company.

Portfolio changes:

During the review period, the Fund's exposure to the energy and industrials sectors was increased. In the energy sector, the portfolio manager increased exposure to Canada-based natural gas firm Cenovus Energy. In the industrials sector, exposure was increased to Canada-based waste management firm Waste Connections. The portfolio manager believes these companies offer attractive long-term growth potential.

In contrast, exposure to the health care and utilities sectors was decreased. In the health care sector, the portfolio manager exited a position in Switzerland-based pharmaceutical firm Roche Holding. In the utilities sector, exposure was reduced to Canada-based utilities firm Fortis. The portfolio manager sought opportunities with more potential elsewhere.

At the end of the review period, the Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the financials sector, followed by the energy sector. The Fund diverged most from its benchmark's sector weightings by having more exposure to the utilities sector and less exposure to the financials sector.

Recent Developments

Portfolio manager Don Newman believes that the outlook for dividend investing appears more favourable moving forward, with the possibility of interest rates having reached their peak and potentially declining in the future. The portfolio manager believes that many dividend paying equities are now trading at reasonable prices, and are potentially offering yields that could grow over time, while the yields of competing asset classes may lose their attractiveness as interest rates are reduced. The portfolio manager continues to position the portfolio with a focus on reasonable price-to-earnings multiples with an attractive yield and earnings growth potential, in addition to having balance sheet strength. The portfolio manager also continues to emphasize understanding what you own, and owning what the manager believes are high-quality companies.

Effective September 19, 2023, Anne Bell of Mississauga, Ontario, became a member of the Independent Review Committee (IRC).

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund is only offered in Series O securities and is only available to: (i) institutional investors who may be individuals or financial institutions who have been approved by Fidelity and have entered into Series O fund purchase agreements with Fidelity; or (ii) other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity. The Fund does not pay management and advisory fees, or other operating expenses, other than certain specified fund costs, including taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges.

Brokerage Commissions

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity Investments were \$0 for the period ended June 30, 2024. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution of transactions with affiliates, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity Investments, at least once per year.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

^G The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

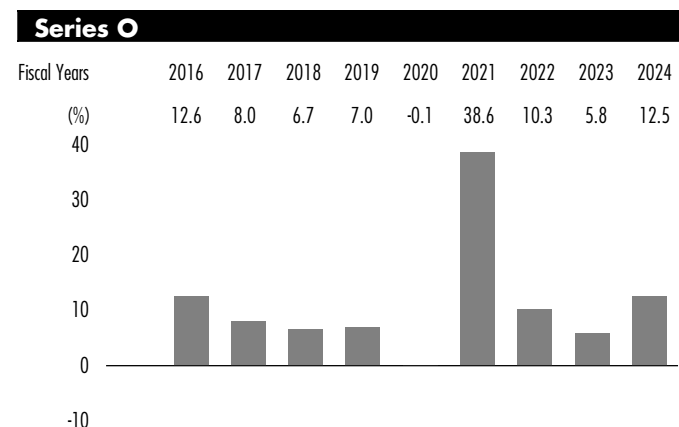

The Fund's benchmark consists of 100% of S&P/TSX Composite Dividend Index.

Prior to June 1, 2023, the Fund's benchmark consisted of 100% of MSCI Canada Value Capped Index.

The MSCI Canada Value Capped Index seeks to measure the performance of the Canadian value equity market. Value equities are defined as having a higher dividend yield and lower price - to - book and price - to - earnings ratios relative to the broader Canadian equity market.

The S&P/TSX Composite Dividend Index includes all stocks in the S&P/TSX Composite with positive indicated annual dividend yields as of the latest rebalancing of the S&P/TSX Composite Index.

The S&P/TSX Composite Index is an index of stocks generally considered to represent the Canadian equity market. The S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index is the same as the S&P/TSX Composite Index except it is adjusted quarterly so that no single stock has a relative weight in the Index greater than 10.0%.
