## **Management Discussion of Fund Performance**

#### **Investment Objective and Strategies**

Investment Objective: Fidelity Convertible Securities Multi-Asset Base Fund (Fund) aims to provide a steady flow of income and the potential for capital gains by investing primarily in convertible securities of issuers located in the U.S.

Strategies: The portfolio management team invests primarily in convertible securities, which are often non-investment grade fixed income securities. When buying and selling securities for the Fund, the portfolio management team examines each issuer's potential for success based on its current financial condition and industry position, as well as economic and market conditions. The Fund may also invest in convertible securities of non-U.S. issuers, invest in fixed income securities of any quality or term, invest in China A-Shares and may hold cash.

#### Risk

The risks associated with investing in this Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. Any changes to the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund is suitable for medium- to long-term investors who want to seek income and the potential for capital gains from exposure to convertible securities, and can handle the volatility of returns generally associated with equity investments. The Fund is not an appropriate investment for investors with a short-term investment horizon. To invest in the Fund, investors should be willing to accept a medium level of risk. The suitability of the investment has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

#### **Results of Operations**

Securities of this Fund are only available for purchase by other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity, and are not available for public purchase.

Fidelity Convertible Securities Multi-Asset Base Fund, Series O, returned 10.8%, for the year ended June 30, 2024. During the review period, U.S. Fixed Income, as represented by the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index, returned 6.1% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

U.S. investment-grade bonds, as broadly represented by the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index, returned 6.1% in Canadian dollar terms and 2.6% in U.S. dollar terms, for the one-year period ended June 30, 2024.

U.S. investment-grade bonds advanced in Canadian and U.S. dollar terms over the period under review. High yield bonds outperformed their investment-grade peers, benefitting from higher yields and tighter credit spreads. After a sharp decline in November and December 2023, the 10-year U.S. treasury yield demonstrated an overall upward trend until April 2024, followed by a gradual decline for the remainder of the review period. Despite U.S. inflation easing over the review period, with annual headline inflation at 3.4% in April 2024, the U.S. Federal Reserve (the Fed) continued to hold its benchmark interest rate in a range of 5.25%—5.50%. While the Fed acknowledged that inflationary pressures have moderated, they also noted that current inflation readings remained elevated, with economic activity and job gains continuing to expand. With that, a sense of caution prevailed among market participants as the labour market continued to adjust, and geopolitical tensions weighed on investor sentiment.

#### Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the ICE BofA All U.S. Convertibles Index, returned 9.8% for the period under review. The Fund outperformed its benchmark due to its investments in the energy sector. In this sector, out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based crude oil tanker company DHT Holdings, and Monaco-based tanker shipping company Scorpio Tankers, contributed to relative returns. Holdings in the information technology sector also contributed to relative returns. In this sector, an investment in U.S.-based business intelligence company MicroStrategy, and lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based semiconductor products manufacturer Wolfspeed, contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, an investment in U.S.-based integrated energy company NRG Energy, and lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based solar energy company Sunnova, also contributed to relative returns.

In contrast, exposure to certain stocks in the health care sector detracted from relative returns. In the sector, lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based biopharmaceutical company Cytokinetics, and to U.S.-based medical devices company DexCom, detracted from relative returns. Lower-than-benchmark exposure to the financials sector also detracted from relative performance. In this sector, lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based private equity firm KKR & Co., and to U.S.-based payment processing company Shift4 Payments, detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based energy technology company Babcock & Wilcox, and lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based cybersecurity company Palo Alto Networks, also detracted from relative returns.

At the end of the review period, the Fund had no exposure to Babcock & Wilcox or KKR & Co.

Portfolio changes:

During the review period, portfolio manager Adam Kramer increased the Fund's exposure to the utilities and financials sectors, given their attractive valuations in the portfolio manager's view. In the utilities sector, the portfolio manager increased exposure to U.S.-based renewable energy company NextEra Energy Partners. In the financials sector, the portfolio manager initiated a position in U.S.-based asset management firm Apollo Global Management.

In contrast, the Fund's exposure to the consumer staples and communication services sectors was reduced. In the consumer staples sector, the portfolio manager exited a position in U.S.-based consumer products company Turning Point Brands. In the communication services sector, exposure was reduced to U.S.-based social media and camera company Snap. The

portfolio manager sought opportunities that appeared to have better investment upside potential in other sectors.

At the end of the review period, the Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the information technology sector, followed by the health care sector. The Fund diverged most from its benchmark's sector weightings by having more exposure to the information technology sector and less exposure to the health care sector.

#### **Recent Developments**

Looking ahead, lead portfolio manager Adam Kramer will be diligently assessing market conditions, and seek market segments and specific securities that have been substantially mispriced. The portfolio manager's goal is to uncover opportunities that, in the manager's view, have the potential to deliver equity-like returns during favourable market conditions, coupled with reduced volatility and enhanced capital preservation. The portfolio manager stands ready to adapt the portfolio swiftly as opportunities arise.

Effective January 1, 2024, Rick Gandhi was added as a Portfolio Manager.

Effective September 19, 2023, Anne Bell of Mississauga, Ontario, became a member of the Independent Review Committee (IRC).

#### **Related Party Transactions**

#### Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund is only offered in Series O securities and is only available to: (i) institutional investors who may be individuals or financial institutions who have been approved by Fidelity and have entered into Series O fund purchase agreements with Fidelity; or (ii) other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity. The Fund does not pay management and advisory fees, or other operating expenses, other than certain specified fund costs, including taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges.

#### **Brokerage Commissions**

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity Investments were \$5,000 for the period ended June 30, 2024. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution of transactions with affiliates, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity Investments, at least once per year.

#### Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

#### Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

#### **Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions**

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

(i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;

(ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.


<sup>6</sup> The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

The ICE BofA All U.S. Convertibles Index is a market capitalization weighted index of domestic U.S. corporate convertible securities including mandatory convertible preferred.

Effective January 1, 2020, the ICE BofAML indices were rebranded as ICE BofA indices.

The Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index is an unmanaged, market-value-weighted index of taxable investment-grade fixed-rate debt issues, including government, corporate, asset-backed, and mortgage backed securities, with maturities of one year or more.

On August 24, 2016, Bloomberg purchased the Barclays family of benchmark indices. As part of this transaction, all Barclays benchmark indices have been co-branded as the Bloomberg Barclays Indices for an initial period of 5 years. Effective August 24, 2021 the Bloomberg Barclays fixed income benchmark indices were rebranded as the Bloomberg Indices. This change occurred as planned at the end of the five-year period following Bloomberg's acquisition of Barclays Risk Analytics and Index Solutions (BRAIS) in August of 2016.
