Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: Fidelity U.S. High Quality Currency Neutral ETF (Fund) seeks to replicate, to the extent reasonably possible and before fees and expenses, the performance of the Fidelity Canada U.S. High Quality Currency Neutral Index (Index). The Fund invests primarily in equity securities of large- and mid-capitalization U.S. companies with a higher quality profile than the broader U.S. equity market. The Fund can invest in these securities either directly or indirectly through investments in other underlying funds. The Fund uses derivatives to try to minimize the exposure of currency fluctuations between the U.S. and Canadian dollars.

Strategies: In order to achieve its investment objective, the Fund normally holds securities of Fidelity U.S. High Quality ETF (Underlying Fund).

The reported performance of the Fund and the Underlying Fund will not be the same, primarily because: (i) each Fidelity ETF has its own fees and expenses, which will affect returns (in the case of the Fund, this includes the cost of the currency forwards used to hedge its U.S. dollar exposure to the Canadian dollar, which will generally result in a lower return); and (ii) the Fund may not be able to fully hedge its U.S. dollar exposure at all times. The Index is designed to reflect the performance of stocks of large- and mid-capitalization dividend-paying U.S. companies that are expected to continue to pay and grow their dividends and have a positive correlation of returns with increasing 10-year U.S. Treasury yields. The universe of stocks for consideration in the Index consists of the largest 1,000 U.S. stocks based on float-adjusted market capitalization. The Index hedges its U.S. dollar currency exposure to the Canadian dollar.

The Index is provided by Fidelity Product Services LLC (the Index Provider). The Index represents an example of what is commonly referred to as a smart beta investment methodology. Smart beta refers to alternative index construction rules compared to the traditional market capitalization-based approach. The Index is constructed using the Index Provider's rules-based proprietary index methodology and is designed to provide investors with exposure to targeted strategic factors. Securities are identified for inclusion in the Index based on their composite factor score, which is a weighted average score based on certain dividend factors. Composite scores for the Index are calculated based on four dividend factors: (i) dividend yield; (ii) payout ratio; (iii) dividend growth; and (iv) correlation with 10-year U.S. Treasury yields. Dividend yield is calculated based on trailing dividends over the last twelve months over price per share. Payout ratio is calculated based on trailing dividends over the last twelve months over earnings per share. Dividend growth is calculated based on trailing dividends over the last twelve months over dividends from one year ago. Correlation with 10-year U.S. Treasury yields is calculated based on the correlation of weekly changes in the 10-year U.S. Treasury yield with weekly stock returns. Composite factor scores are calculated by weighting dividend yield at 63%, payout ratio at 13.5%, dividend growth at 13.5% and correlation to 10-year U.S. treasury yields at 10%. Composite factor scores are adjusted to remove size bias by blending the composite score with a size factor. Index construction is an iterative process of combining the composite factor score, size adjustment, security selection and security weighting.

The Index is rebalanced on an annual basis on the third Friday of February using data as at the close of business on the day that is 10 business days prior to the scheduled rebalance.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in this Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. Any changes in the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund is suitable for medium- to long-term investors who want to gain exposure to dividend-paying equity securities of U.S. companies while seeking to lower their risk of currency fluctuations between the U.S. and Canadian dollar, who are seeking income and the potential for capital gains, who can handle the volatility of returns generally associated with equity investments, and who are willing to accept a medium level of risk. The suitability of the investment has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

Fidelity U.S. High Quality Currency Neutral ETF returned 26.1% for the one-year period ended March 31, 2024. The S&P 500 Index – Hedged CAD, broadly representative of U.S. equities, returned 28.5% (in Canadian dollar terms) during the same period.

Market overview:

U.S. equities, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, returned 29.9% in Canadian dollar terms and 29.9% in U.S. dollar terms, for the one-year period ended March 31, 2024.

U.S. equities rose during the review period, buoyed by signs of easing inflationary pressures, strong corporate earnings, and persistent economic growth. Positive investor sentiment around microchip manufacturers and companies with exposure to artificial intelligence supported growth in U.S. equities. Additionally, equity markets were supported by the U.S. Federal Reserve's rate-cut projections which generally showed that policymakers expect to cut rates in 2024. The U.S. economy expanded at an annual rate of 3.4% in the fourth quarter of 2023. Moreover, throughout the period, investor sentiment improved in anticipation of a resilient economy and the potential for continued moderation in inflation. These factors provided a favourable environment for equities against the backdrop of monetary tightening throughout 2022 and for most of 2023. In the policy meeting held in March 2024, the U.S. Federal Open Markets Committee held the Federal Funds rate unchanged to a target range of 5.25%–5.50%.

Factors affecting performance:

During the review period returned 25.4%. The Fund outperformed the Index for the review period. Typically, the primary reason for the difference in returns between the Fund and the Index was that the total return of the Fund was reduced by the management fee paid or payable by the Fund, as well as brokerage and commission costs incurred in acquiring and rebalancing the portfolio of securities held by the Fund, and taxes (including withholding taxes, where applicable) and other expenses paid or payable by the Fund. These fees and expenses are not included in the calculation of the performance of the Index.

On an absolute basis, the Underlying Fund's exposure to U.S.-based semiconductors company Nvidia, U.S.-based software company Microsoft and U.S.-based semiconductors company Broadcom contributed to absolute returns, while exposure to U.S.-based apparel company Nike, U.S.-based transportation company United Parcel Services and U.S.-based pharmaceuticals company Pfizer detracted from absolute returns.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had no exposure to Nike or United Parcel Services.

Portfolio changes:

At the sector level, relative to the S&P 500 Index – Hedged CAD, the Underlying Fund had its highest relative weightings in the industrials, consumer discretionary and energy sectors and its lowest relative weightings in the communication services, health care and financials sectors.

The Index is rebalanced on a semi-annual basis on the third Friday of February and August using data as at the close of business on the day that is ten business days prior to the scheduled rebalancing. Accordingly, the composition of the Underlying Fund may change, resulting in different sector and security weightings.

Derivatives disclosure:

During the period under review, the Fund engaged in forward foreign currency contracts, in a manner consistent with its investment objectives and strategies, to hedge against the effect of currency fluctuations on the investment returns of the Fund. The use of forward contracts in this manner does not completely eliminate the impact of currency fluctuations on returns, and the Fund's returns will differ from the local currency returns of the Underlying Fund's investments.

Recent Developments

Since the investment objective of the Fund is to seek to replicate, to the extent possible before fees and expenses, the performance of the Index, the Fund is not actively managed by traditional methods. Consequently, the Fund will continue to be invested in securities in accordance with its investment objective and strategies and will generally not be affected by market developments unless the constituent securities included in the Index change in response to those developments.

Effective September 19, 2023, Anne Bell of Mississauga, Ontario, became a member of the Independent Review Committee (IRC).

Effective December 1, 2023, the word "Index" was removed from the Fund's name.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader group of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements.

The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$18,000 for the period ended March 31, 2024.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and *In specie* Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and *In specie* Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another Fund, investment fund or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Brokerage Commissions

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity Investments, including National Financial Services LLC, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity Investments were \$0 for the period ended March 31, 2024. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution of transactions with affiliates, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity Investments, at least once per year.

A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of the portfolio securities, excluding short-term securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized.

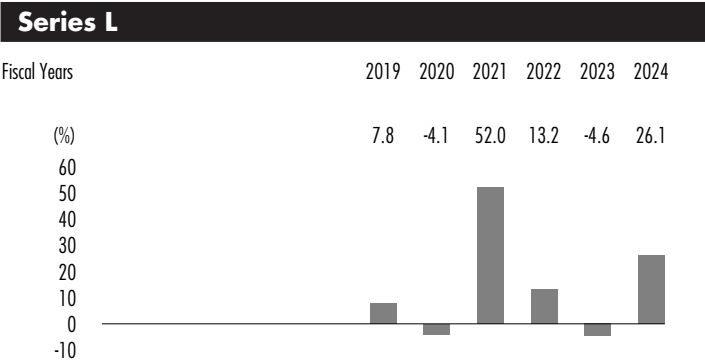
