Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: Fidelity U.S. Focused Stock Class (Fund) aims to achieve long-term capital growth. It seeks a return similar to that of Fidelity U.S. Focused Stock Fund (Underlying Fund), by investing substantially all of its assets in securities of the Underlying Fund. The Underlying Fund aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity securities of U.S. companies.

Strategies: The portfolio manager focuses primarily on a company's fundamentals and invests in shares of companies that trade at prices that reflect attractive valuations based on its assessment of each company's potential for growth and earnings. When buying and selling equity securities for the Underlying Fund, the portfolio manager examines each company's potential for success in light of its current financial condition, industry conditions, valuation, earnings estimates, balance sheet strength, quality of management, as well as economic and market conditions. The Underlying Fund may invest in companies of any size and concentrate its investments in relatively few companies and industries. It may invest up to approximately 10% of its net assets in non-U.S. equity securities. It may hold cash and invest in fixed-income securities.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in this Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. Any changes to the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund is suitable for medium- to long-term investors who want to gain U.S. equity exposure, and can handle the volatility of returns generally associated with equity investments.

Registered plan investors should be aware that the Fund may, from time to time, bear an income tax expense which will reduce returns. To invest in the Fund, investors should be willing to accept a medium level of risk. The suitability of the investment has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

Fidelity U.S. Focused Stock Class, Series B, returned 49.0%, after fees and expenses, for the twelve-month period ended November 30, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, U.S. equities, as represented by the S&P 500 Index, returned 38.3% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

U.S. equities, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, returned 38.3% in Canadian dollar terms and 33.9% in U.S. dollar terms for the one-year period ended November 30, 2024.

U.S. equities rose over the review period as expectations of easier monetary policy and continued corporate earnings growth supported investor sentiment. The information technology and communication services sectors delivered strong performance, as advances in artificial intelligence supported investor optimism about earnings growth and the outlook for broad-based productivity gains for the U.S. and the global economy. In addition, companies within the financials sector advanced on signs of a more favourable interest rate environment along with a resilient economic backdrop. Other cyclical sectors, such as industrials and consumer discretionary also delivered positive returns. Towards the end of the review period, there was a shift in sector performance as investors turned to the utilities sector in search of income, while concerns about stretched valuations in the information technology and communication services sectors led to corrections in some of the largest Al-linked companies. The U.S. economy exhibited healthy growth, expanding by 2.8% in the third quarter, supported by robust consumer and government spending. However, geopolitical risks, mixed economic signals in the U.S., and the U.S. Federal Reserve's (the Fed) adoption of a more cautious approach to its monetary policy easing cycle introduced some volatility. Over the period under review, the Fed reduced its benchmark rate of interest twice in subsequent meetings (the Fed Funds Rate) from 5.5% to 5.0% in the September meeting and from 5.0% to 4.75% in the November meeting. U.S. inflation, as measured by the consumer price index, fell to 2.6% in October 2024 from 3.4% in December 2023.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund outperformed its benchmark, the S&P 500 Index, primarily due to the Underlying Fund's investments in, and overweight exposure to, the consumer discretionary sector. In the sector, an investment in U.S.-based thermal management company Modine Manufacturing, and an investment in U.S.-based used car dealer Carvana Co., contributed to relative returns. In addition, exposure to certain stocks in the information technology sector contributed to relative performance. In this sector, an investment in U.S.-based semiconductors companies NVIDIA and Micron Technology contributed to relative returns. Among other sectors, investments in U.S.-based energy company Constellation Energy Corporation, and U.S.-based media and entertainment firm Meta Platforms, both contributed to relative returns, as did out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based critical infrastructure solutions company Vertiv Holdings.

In contrast, investments in, and underweight exposure to, the financials sector detracted from relative performance, particularly out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based cryptocurrency exchange platform company Coinbase Global, and an investment in U.S.-based financial services firm S&P Global. In addition, lower-than-benchmark exposure to, and investments in, the energy sector detracted from relative returns. In the sector, out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based natural gas and liquids company Antero Resources Corporation, and to Canada-based oil and gas exploration and production firm PrairieSky Royalty, detracted from relative returns. Among other sectors, lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based multinational computer technology company Oracle, and an investment in U.S.-based data storage company Western Digital Corporation, detracted from relative returns.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had no exposure to Micron Technology, Coinbase Global, S&P Global or Antero Resources Corporation. Portfolio changes:

During the review period, the Underlying Fund's exposure to the consumer discretionary and financials sectors was increased. In the consumer discretionary sector, the portfolio manager initiated the position in Modine Manufacturing. In the financial sector, a position was initiated in U.S.-based bank holding company M&T Bank. The portfolio manager believes these companies have good investment growth potential.

In contrast, exposure to the information technology and communication services sectors was decreased. In the information technology sector, the portfolio manager reduced exposure to U.S.-based software and services firm Microsoft. In the communication services sector, exposure was reduced to U.S.-based multinational technology company Alphabet. The portfolio manager preferred to pursue other opportunities the manager believes have more upside potential.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the information technology sector, followed by the consumer discretionary sector. The Underlying Fund diverged most from its benchmark's sector weightings by having more exposure to the industrials sector and less exposure to the information technology sector.

Recent Developments

Portfolio manager Stephen DuFour manages a concentrated portfolio, investing in companies the portfolio manager believes will, over time, offer growth at reasonable prices. The portfolio manager seeks investments that the manager believes could grow earnings materially faster than the market, and that are still trading at attractive valuations. Sector and industry positioning is a result of the portfolio manager's best fundamental ideas rather than top-down sector calls. The portfolio manager has an optimistic long-term view on U.S. markets as new technologies continue to emerge, and believes disruption in various industries may continue to offer great opportunities. The portfolio manager continues to believe the market environment is ripe for stock selection, and emphasizes the potential for increased prices driven by quality earnings growth and expanding multiples, especially as macro headwinds alleviate, and earnings continue to strengthen in 2025.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$4,591,000 for the period ended November 30, 2024.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$503,000 for the period ended November 30, 2024.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.


Year-by-Year Returns


