Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: Fidelity Corporate Bond Class (Fund) aims to provide a steady flow of income. It seeks a return similar to that of Fidelity Corporate Bond Fund (Underlying Fund) by investing substantially all of its assets in securities of the Underlying Fund. The Underlying Fund aims to provide a steady flow of income by investing primarily in fixed-income securities issued by Canadian and foreign companies.

Strategies: The Underlying Fund invests primarily in fixed-income securities issued by Canadian and foreign companies. The portfolio managers of the Underlying Fund use the FTSE Canada All Corporate Bond Index (Capped) as a guide to structuring the Underlying Fund and selecting investments. While the portfolio managers manage the Underlying Fund to have overall interest rate risk similar to that of the Index, the Underlying Fund's specific investments may or may not be included in the Index. The portfolio managers allocate the Underlying Fund's assets among issuers in different industry sectors, like financials and industrials, and different maturities based on the portfolio managers' view of the relative value of each issuer, sector, industry or maturity.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in this Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. Any changes to the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund is suitable for medium-term investors who want to seek income from their investment. To invest in the Fund, investors should be willing to accept a low level of risk. The suitability of the investment has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

Fidelity Corporate Bond Class, Series B, returned 10.1%, after fees and expenses, for the twelve-month period ended November 30, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, Canadian bonds, as represented by the FTSE Canada All Corporate Bond Index (Capped), returned 10.7% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

Canadian investment-grade bonds, as broadly represented by the FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index, returned 8.6% for the one-year period ended November 30, 2024.

Canadian investment-grade bonds rose over the period under review, as the Bank of Canada (the BoC) announced several interest rate cuts, the inflation rate declined rapidly, and the Canadian economy grew at a slower pace than expected. Towards the end of the review period, longer-maturity Canadian government bond yields rose, despite a 50-basis point interest rate cut by the BoC. Canada's Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation is now around 2.0%, at the BoC's target, mainly due to lower energy prices and weakened inflationary pressures. While energy exports are rising, growth in business investment and government spending has slowed, and excess supply in the economy persists. Employment has softened, with wage growth outpacing productivity gains. Economic growth is projected to gradually strengthen through 2025-2026, supported by lower interest rates, steady consumer spending, and robust export demand. Canada's GDP growth exceeded expectations in the second quarter but appears weaker for the third quarter, with GDP per capita continuing to decline into the end of 2024.

Factors affecting performance:

During the period under review, the Fund underperformed its benchmark, the FTSE Canada All Corporate Bond Index (Capped), after fees and expenses, but outperformed before fees and expenses. The Underlying Fund's out-of-benchmark exposure to non-Canadian investment-grade bonds, non-Canadian high-yield bonds, and emerging market bonds contributed to relative returns. In contrast, lower-than-benchmark exposure to corporate bonds in the financials and energy sectors detracted from relative returns, as did yield curve positioning.

Portfolio changes:

The portfolio managers increased exposure to the communication sector to take advantage of attractive new issue opportunities. The Underlying Fund's allocations to non-Canadian investment-grade bonds were decreased during the review period. The portfolio managers believed there were better opportunities elsewhere.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had its largest exposure to issuers in the financials sector, followed by the energy sector.

Recent Developments

Portfolio managers Sri Tella and Lee Ormiston highlight that after cutting rates aggressively over the past 6 months, both the Bank of Canada and the Federal Reserve have hinted that any additional cuts will be more measured and dependent on how the outlook for the economy evolves. As a result, rates have risen over the past few months as markets are now pricing in a shallower path of rate cuts going forward. The managers emphasize that the political landscape in both Canada and the U.S., including its impact on fiscal policy and trade, will be closely monitored, and has introduced uncertainty to the outlook. The largest exposure in corporate bonds continues to be Financials (mostly banks) as the sector remains attractive relative to industrials and offers greater liquidity. Looking forward, the portfolio managers believe that the overall level of interest rates continues to be attractive on an historical basis and are priced given the monetary policy backdrop. Credit spreads, while trading at rich valuations, are also being supported by the yield backdrop.

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$79,000 for the period ended November 30, 2024.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$13,000 for the period ended November 30, 2024.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

The net assets attributable to securityholders per security presented in the financial statements may differ from the net asset value calculated for fund pricing purposes. - ^B Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of securities outstanding at the relevant time. The increase (decrease) from operations is based on the weighted average number of securities outstanding over the financial period. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of beginning to ending net assets per security.
- ^C Distributions were paid in cash or reinvested in additional securities of the Fund, or both, and excludes any applicable distributions of management fee reduction to securityholders.
- ^D This information is provided as at period end of the year shown.
- ^E Prior period amounts may have been adjusted.
- ^F Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding distributions, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset values during the period, including the Fund's pro-rata share of estimated expenses incurred in any underlying investment fund, if applicable.

The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.

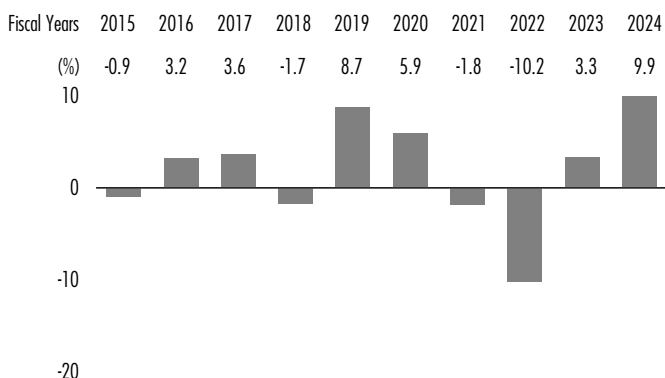

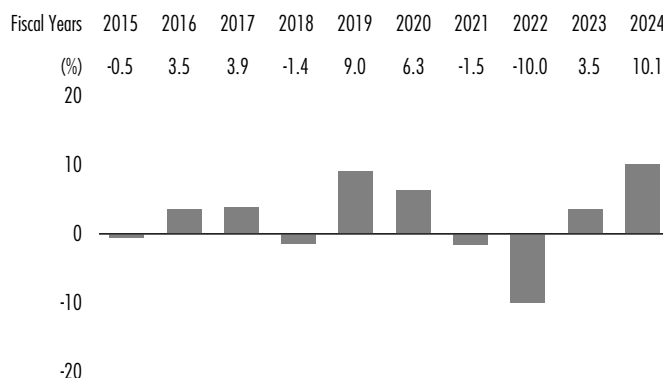
Year-by-Year Returns

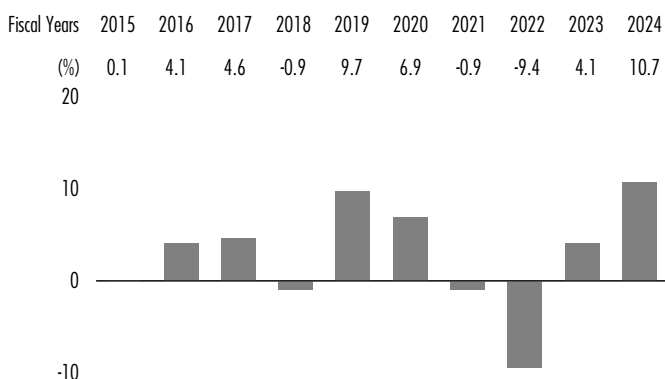

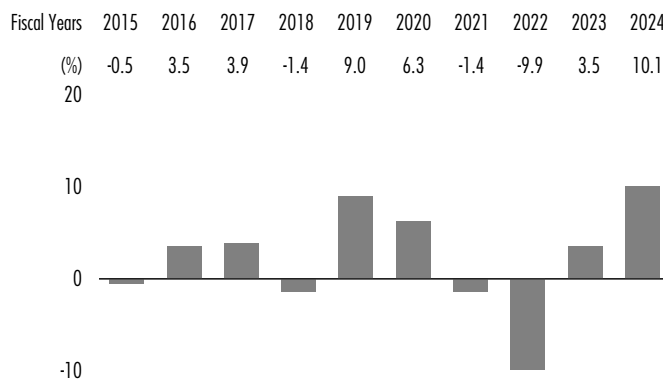

With a 5.0% cap, the Index will see a maximum benchmark weighting of 5.0% on all single issuers in the Index.

Effective April 12, 2019, the FTSE TMX Canada indices were renamed as FTSE Canada indices as a result of FTSE Russell's acquisition of FTSE TMX Global Debt Capital Markets Limited.

Each series of the Fund will have different returns because of differences in management fees and expenses.
