Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: Fidelity Japan Fund (Fund) aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity securities of Japanese companies.

Strategies: When buying and selling securities for the Fund, the portfolio manager examines each company's potential success by evaluating its current financial position and industry position, as well as economic and market conditions. The portfolio manager considers factors like growth potential, earnings estimates and quality of management. The Fund may invest in small, medium, and large-sized companies.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in this Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. Any changes to the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund is suitable for long-term investors who want to gain exposure to Japanese companies, and can handle the volatility of returns generally associated with equity investments. The Fund is not an appropriate investment for investors with a short-term investment horizon. To invest in the Fund, investors should be willing to accept a medium level of risk. The suitability of the investment has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

Fidelity Japan Fund, Series B, returned 19.5%, after fees and expenses, for the one-year period ended March 31, 2024. The net returns of the other series of this Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, global equities, as represented by the MSCI World Index, returned 25.1% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

Global equities, as broadly measured by the MSCI World Index, returned 25.1% in Canadian dollar terms and 25.1% in U.S. dollar terms, for the one-year period ended March 31, 2024.

Global equities advanced during the review period, as economic expansion, and the slowing pace of inflation in some countries provided a mostly favourable backdrop. Following continued tightening of monetary policies in major developed market economies throughout 2022 and for most of 2023, investor sentiment shifted in the fourth quarter of 2023 to a view that interest rates had peaked, and policymakers may cut rates in 2024. Equity market gains were partly fueled by select firms within the information technology and communication services sectors in the U.S., largely due to market exuberance surrounding artificial intelligence. In Europe, several large-capitalisation companies across the luxury goods, pharmaceuticals, and technology sectors supported equity markets. Japanese equities also rose, supported by decline in the value of the yen which bolstered exports, as well as due to corporate governance reforms that have boosted shareholder returns through increased share buybacks and dividends. From a regional perspective, while some global equity markets advanced to hit all-time highs, investors were more cautious towards Chinese equities due to the country's weaker than expected economic growth amid uncertainty surrounding the health of its property and banking sectors.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the Tokyo Stock Price Index (TOPIX), returned 24.3% during the review period. The Fund underperformed its benchmark primarily due to investments in certain stocks in the information technology sector. In the information technology sector, an investment in Japan-based software testing firm SHIFT, and lower-than-benchmark exposure to Japan-based semiconductor firm Tokyo Electron, detracted from relative returns. Higher-than-benchmark exposure to, and investments in, the health care sector also detracted from relative returns. In this sector, investments in Japan-based pharmaceutical firms Daiichi Sankyo and Eisai detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, a lack of exposure to a Japan-based automotive manufacturer, and an investment in Japan-based management consulting firm BayCurrent Consulting, detracted from relative returns.

In contrast, exposure to certain stocks in the industrials sector contributed to relative returns. In the sector, investments in Japan-based diversified industrial conglomerates Mitsubishi Heavy Industries and Hitachi contributed to relative returns. In addition, lack of exposure to the communication services sector contributed to relative returns. In that sector, lack of exposure to certain Japan-based telecommunications firms contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, investments in Japan-based banks financial holding company Mitsubishi UFJ Financial, Japan-based semiconductor firm Lasertec Corporation, and Japan-based retail company Fast Retailing, contributed to relative returns.

At the end of the review period, the Fund had no exposure to Tokyo Electron or BayCurrent Consulting.

Portfolio Changes:

During the review period, the Fund's exposure to the financials and consumer discretionary sectors was increased. In the financials sector, the portfolio manager increased exposure to Japan-based banks financial holding firm Mitsubishi UFJ Financial. In the consumer discretionary sector, a position was initiated in Japan-based automotive manufacturer Suzuki Motor. The portfolio manager believes these companies have good investment growth potential.

In contrast, exposure to the industrials and materials sectors was decreased, as the portfolio manager pursued investment growth opportunities elsewhere with more potential. In the industrials sector, the portfolio manager exited a position in Japan-based air conditioners and refrigerants manufacturer Daikin Industries. In the materials sector, exposure was reduced to

Japan-based steel firm Nippon Steel.

At the end of the review period, the Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the industrials sector, followed by the consumer discretionary sector. The Fund diverged most from its benchmark's sector weightings by having more exposure to the health care sector and less exposure to the communication services sector.

Recent Developments

The Fund's portfolio manager Eileen Dobb is positive on Japan's equities as the economy transitions into a mildly inflationary state, following decades of stagnant growth and falling prices. The portfolio manager expects that wage increases will have a knock-on effect of boosting consumption and supporting further price gains. At the same time, the portfolio manager believes corporate governance reforms in Japan continue to unlock equity market value, and companies may focus more on dividends and buybacks. As a result, the shareholder return profile of Japanese companies may improve faster than most other developed markets, in the portfolio manager's view. Against this backdrop, the portfolio manager continues to seek structurally competitive companies the portfolio manager believes are consistently growing, with potentially improving returns to shareholders, or companies the portfolio manager believes appear inexpensively valued and are expected to recover.

Effective September 19, 2023, Anne Bell of Mississauga, Ontario, became a member of the Independent Review Committee (IRC).

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$468,000 for the period ended March 31, 2024.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$73,000 for the period ended March 31, 2024.

Brokerage Commissions

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity Investments were \$0 for the period ended March 31, 2024. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution of transactions with affiliates, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity Investments, at least once per year.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

- ^A This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual and/or unaudited interim financial statements. The net assets attributable to securityholders per security presented in the financial statements may differ from the net asset value calculated for fund pricing purposes. An explanation of these differences can be found in the notes to financial statements.
- ^B Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of securities outstanding at the relevant time. The increase (decrease) from operations is based on the weighted average number of securities outstanding over the financial period. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of beginning to ending net assets per security.
- ^C Distributions were paid in cash or reinvested in additional securities of the Fund, or both, and excludes any applicable distributions of management fee reduction to securityholders. Distributions are presented based on management's best estimate of the tax character.
- ^D This information is provided as at period end of the year shown.
- ^E Prior period amounts may have been adjusted.
- ^F Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding distributions, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset values during the period, including the Fund's pro-rata share of estimated expenses incurred in any underlying investment fund, if applicable.
- ^G Effective November 1, 2014, the manager of the Fund has waived a portion of its administration fee and as of the date of the MRFP has continued to provide the Fund with such waivers. The manager may terminate the waiver at any time, at its sole discretion. It is not known when such waivers will be terminated.
- ^H The trading expense ratio represents total commissions, other portfolio transaction costs and dividends and interest expense on securities sold short expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period, including the Fund's pro-rata share of estimated trading costs incurred in any underlying investment fund, if applicable.
- ^I The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.





