# **Management Discussion of Fund Performance**

#### **Results of Operations**

Fidelity American Equity Class (Fund) invests substantially all of its assets in securities of Fidelity American Equity Fund (Underlying Fund).

Fidelity American Equity Class, Series B, returned 10.7%, after fees and expenses, for the six-month period ended May 31, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, U.S. equities, as represented by the S&P 500 Index, returned 17.0% (in Canadian dollar terms).

#### Market overview:

U.S. equities, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, returned 17.0% in Canadian dollar terms and 16.4% in U.S. dollar terms, for the six-month period ended May 31, 2024.

U.S. equities rose during the review period. Strong corporate earnings, persistent economic growth, and a potential peak in the interest rate hiking cycles all boosted investor confidence. Select beneficiaries of developments in the artificial intelligence space, mainly within the communication services and information technology sectors, also contributed to gains. However, equity market upside was somewhat limited as investors lowered their expectations of rate-cuts in 2024. This was partly a result of continued strength in the U.S. economy, while inflation, as measured by the U.S. consumer price index, remained persistent at 3.4% in April 2024. The labour market was also strong, with modest signs of softening towards the end of the review period. The U.S. economy created 175,000 new jobs in April (U.S. Nonfarm Payrolls), the smallest increase in six months, while the unemployment rate climbed slightly to 3.9%. Against this backdrop, the U.S. Federal Open Markets Committee held the Federal Funds rate unchanged at 5.25%–5.50% in its May 2024 policy meeting.

#### Factors affecting performance:

The Fund underperformed its benchmark, the S&P 500 Index, primarily due to the Underlying Fund's investments in, and lower-than-benchmark exposure to, the information technology sector. In the sector, lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based semiconductor firm NVIDIA, and lack of exposure to another U.S.-based semiconductor firm, detracted from relative returns. Investments in certain stocks in the financials sector also detracted from relative returns. In this sector, investments in U.K.-based insurance firm AON, and U.S.-based professional services firm Marsh McLennan, detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, an investment in U.S.-based health insurance firm UnitedHealth Group, and out-of-benchmark exposure to Canada-based convenience stores operator Alimentation Couche-Tard, detracted from relative returns.

In contrast, investments in, and lower-than-benchmark exposure to, the consumer discretionary sector contributed to relative returns. In this sector, lack of exposure to a U.S.-based automotive and clean energy firm, and out-of-benchmark exposure to Canada-based retail firm Dollarama, contributed to relative returns. In addition, lack of exposure to the real estate sector contributed to relative returns. In this sector, lack of exposure to U.S.-based equity real estate investment trusts (REITs) contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based equity real estate investment trusts (REITs) contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based technology firm Apple, an investment in U.S.-based health care facilities firm HCA Healthcare, and out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based technology hardware and equipment firm Pure Storage, all contributed to relative returns.

During the review period, the Underlying Fund's exposure to the utilities and communication services sectors was increased. In the utilities sector, the portfolio manager initiated a position in U.S.-based gas and electric utility holding firm Southern Company. In the communication services sector, exposure was increased to U.S.-based social technology firm Meta Platforms. The portfolio manager believes these companies are attractively valued and that they offer sustainable earnings growth over the longer term.

In contrast, exposure to the consumer staples and health care sectors was decreased in favour of what the portfolio manager believed were more attractive opportunities elsewhere. In the consumer staples sector, the portfolio manager exited a position in U.S.-based retail discount stores operator Dollar Tree. In the health care sector, exposure was reduced to U.S.-based pharmaceutical firm Charles River Laboratories.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the financials sector, followed by the health care sector. The Underlying Fund diverged most from its benchmark's sector weightings by having more exposure to the financials sector and less exposure to the information technology sector.

#### **Recent Developments**

Portfolio manager Steve MacMillan remains committed to the investment process, focusing on companies the portfolio manager believes have sustainable, lower-volatility business models, and generally holding them for the long term. Currently, many major sectors are trading at extended multiples, and the portfolio manager prefers to have the Underlying Fund exposed to less sensitive, lower beta areas of the market to reduce cyclicality. The portfolio manager's goal continues to be reducing the overall volatility of the Underlying Fund as the portfolio manager believe that during periods of higher volatility, investor uncertainty may also increase. The portfolio manager seeks to optimize the portfolio's risk/return profiles, while still allowing investors to maintain exposure to the return potential of investing in equities. The portfolio manager is focused on maintaining a disciplined risk profile by emphasizing downside protection, with the goal of protecting investor capital. The portfolio manager believes an investment in U.S. equities is generally not a short-term trade, but rather a long-term strategic allocation with a place in a diversified portfolio.

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$1,458,000 for the period ended May 31, 2024.

#### **Administration Fee**

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$164,000 for the period ended May 31, 2024.

#### Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

#### Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

#### **Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions**

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

(i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;

(ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

#### **Management and Advisory Fees**

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.




