Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Securities of this Fund are only available for purchase by other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity, and are not available for public purchase.

Fidelity Floating Rate High Income Multi-Asset Base Fund (Fund), Series 0, returned 10.3%, for the six-month period ended December 31, 2024. During the review period, U.S. fixed income, as represented by the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index, returned 7.2% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

U.S. investment-grade bonds, as broadly represented by the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index, returned 7.2% in Canadian dollar terms and 2.0% in U.S. dollar terms, for the six-month period ended December 31, 2024.

U.S. investment-grade bonds advanced in Canadian and U.S. dollar terms during the period under review. High yield bonds continued to outperform their investment-grade peers, benefiting from higher yields and tighter credit spreads. Any decreases to headline inflation at the outset of the period were reversed in the later months of the year, with headline inflation increasing to 2.9% in December 2024. The U.S. Federal Reserve (the Fed) commenced their easing cycle with a 50-basis point cut in September followed by a 25-basis point cut in November and December. The U.S.10-year Treasury yield remained volatile and rose towards the end of the review period. This was driven by strong economic data and the concern that, regardless of the election results, the new administration would increase U.S. Treasury issuance to fund a growing budget deficit. The unemployment rate remained at 4.1% in December 2024, unchanged since June 2024, while a separate report showed a sharp increase in the number of job openings and higher employment growth at the end of the review period, reinforcing the view that the labour market remains largely strong.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the Morningstar LSTA U.S. Leveraged Loan Index, returned 9.7% for the review period.

The Fund outperformed its benchmark, primarily due to the Underlying Fund's investments in the financial intermediaries industry and the oil and gas industry. In the financial intermediaries industry, out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based retail company Jo-Ann Stores and U.S.-based investment company WHP Global contributed to relative returns. In the oil and gas industry, an investment in U.S.-based energy infrastructure company New Fortress Energy and an out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based exploration and production company Chesapeake Energy contributed to relative returns. In other industries, investments in U.S.-based electronic device insurance company Asurion and U.S.-based telecommunication company EchoStar also contributed to relative returns.

In contrast, the Fund's investments in the all-telecom industry detracted from relative returns, particularly a lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based telecommunications company CenturyLink and an out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based communications firm Securus Technologies. Investments in the radio and television industry also detracted from relative returns, particularly an investment in U.S.-based sports marketing company Diamond Sports and a lack of exposure to a U.S.-based mass media corporation, detracted from relative returns. In other industries, investments in Malaysia-based property development company Tropicana Corporation Berhad and U.S.-based holding company Franchise Group detracted from relative returns.

Portfolio changes:

The Fund continues to invest across various sectors in the floating rate debt securities market to provide investors with broad market exposure and diversification. The portfolio managers continue to rely on a fundamental research process to identify investment opportunities.

During the period under review, the portfolio managers increased allocations to the electronics and electrical industry and the financial intermediaries industry, and decreased allocations to the business equipment and services industry and cosmetics and toiletries industry. In terms of credit quality, the portfolio managers continue to seek what they believe to be attractive opportunities among B-rated securities.

As at December 31, 2024, B-rated issues accounted for the Fund's largest absolute exposure. In terms of industries, the electronics and electrical industry accounted for the Fund's largest absolute exposure, followed by the business equipment and services industry.

Recent Developments

Portfolio managers Eric Mollenhauer, Kevin Nielsen and Chandler Perine believe that data indicating a robust labour market has reduced market expectations for interest rate cuts in 2025. "Higher for longer" interest rates continue to provide a favorable environment for the leveraged loan market. The managers acknowledge that companies are currently facing higher interest burdens; however, they believe today's interest rate levels are manageable. In fact, they consider this to be a favourable environment in which to use their proprietary research to identify opportunities with strong management teams capable of execution. They are keenly aware of potential headwinds in the short to intermediate term, but believe the Underlying Fund is well positioned for an uncertain economic environment.

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund is only offered in Series 0 securities and is only available to: (i) institutional investors who may be individuals or financial institutions who have been approved by Fidelity and have entered into Series 0 fund purchase agreements with Fidelity; or (ii) other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity. The Fund does not pay management and advisory fees, or other operating expenses, other than certain specified fund costs, including taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charaes.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.


The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.
