## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

### Results of Operations

Securities of this Fund are only available for purchase by other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity, and are not available for public purchase.

Fidelity Global High Yield Multi-Asset Base Fund, Series O, returned 6.8%, for the six-month period ended September 30, 2024. During the review period, global bonds, as represented by the Bloomberg Global Aggregate Bond Index, returned 5.6% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

Global investment-grade bonds, as broadly represented by the Bloomberg Global Aggregate Bond Index, returned 5.6% in Canadian dollar terms and 5.8% in U.S. dollar terms, for the six-month period ended September 30, 2024.

Global investment-grade bonds advanced in Canadian and U.S. dollar terms over the period under review. Government bond yields declined in response to a shift in macroeconomic indicators, and geopolitical tensions continued to weigh on investors' sentiment. In the U.S., annual headline inflation eased to 2.5% in August 2024, while in Europe, the harmonized index of consumer prices fell to 2.2% in August 2024, the lowest level since 2021. The U.S. Federal Reserve (the Fed) approved its first interest rate cut in four years in September 2024, lowering the benchmark policy rate by 50 basis points to 4.75–5.0%. The August jobs report was weaker than expected, indicating a softening U.S. labour market. The European Central Bank reduced its benchmark interest rates by 25 basis points in June and September, bringing the rate down to 3.50%. In contrast, the Bank of Japan announced an increase in its benchmark rate of interest in March and July, marking its first interest rate increase in 17 years. In China, investors were concerned about an uncertain economic outlook, despite supportive policy measures announced by the People's Bank of China.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the ICE BofA Global High Yield Constrained Index, returned 6.9% for the review period. The Fund underperformed its benchmark, primarily due to its investments in, and lower-than-benchmark exposure to, the real estate sector, particularly a lack of exposure to a Luxembourg-based property investor and developer and to a Sweden-based residential real estate owner and industrial partner. Investments in the technology and electronics industry, such as U.S.-based bandgap semiconductor firm Wolfspeed and U.S.-based network infrastructure provider CommScope, detracted from relative returns. In other industries, an investment in France-based financial services company Louvre and a lower-than-benchmark exposure to Mexico-based petroleum company Pemex also detracted from relative returns.

Conversely, investments in, and higher-than-benchmark exposure to, the health care sector contributed to relative returns, particularly investments in U.S.-based health care providers Community Health Systems and Cano Health. Investments in the telecommunications industry also contributed to relative returns. In this industry, investments in France-based telecommunication company Altice France and U.K.-based telecommunications tower company Helios Towers contributed to relative returns. In other industries, an investment in U.S.-based solar energy company Sunnova Energy contributed to relative returns.

Portfolio changes:

During the review period, the Fund's portfolio managers initiated a position in the sovereign industry and increased exposure to the technology and electronics industry, due to what they believe are attractive valuations and strong balance sheets. Conversely, the Fund's exposure to the telecommunications industry and energy sector was decreased over the period.

At the end of the review period, the Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the energy sector, followed by basic industry. The Fund's most significantly higher-than-benchmark allocation was to the technology and electronics industry, and its most significantly lower-than-benchmark exposure was to the banking industry.

Derivatives disclosure:

During the period, the Fund engaged in forward foreign currency contracts, in a manner consistent with its investment objectives and strategies, to hedge against the effect of currency fluctuations on the investment returns of the Fund. The use of forward contracts in this manner does not completely eliminate the impact of currency fluctuations on returns.

### Recent Developments

Portfolio managers Alexandre Karam and Ben Harrison invest in companies that portfolio managers believe to have strong balance sheets, improving fundamental characteristics and strong management teams. The managers strive to uncover these companies through in-depth fundamental credit analysis, while also looking for what portfolio managers believe to be predictable businesses and good returns on capital, as well as policies that support credit improvement. The portfolio managers believe that the fundamental outlook for the U.S. and global economy remains solid, despite the high-interest-rate environment. The labor market appears to be quite robust, and there are indications of positive economic growth in the U.S., while Europe shows some signs of weakness, according to portfolio managers. However, the managers also believe that the current situation has credit spreads in the U.S. that are well inside the long-term average of approximately 500 basis points, suggesting that there may be risks ahead. The managers believe that, although interest rates may continue to decline gradually in the coming months, a policy error in either direction remains a possibility. Therefore, the managers are evaluating opportunities individually on a bottom-up basis.

Fidelity Global Income Portfolio became a holder of more than 10% of the outstanding securities of the Fund in the period ending September 30, 2024.

#### **Manager and Portfolio Adviser**

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund is only offered in Series O securities and is only available to: (i) institutional investors who may be individuals or financial institutions who have been approved by Fidelity and have entered into Series O fund purchase agreements with Fidelity; or (ii) other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity. The Fund does not pay management and advisory fees, or other operating expenses, other than certain specified fund costs, including taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges.

#### **Brokerage Commissions**

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity Investments were \$0 for the period ended September 30, 2024. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution of transactions with affiliates, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity Investments, at least once per year.

#### **Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions**

##### **Independent Review Committee**

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. ##### **Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions**

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

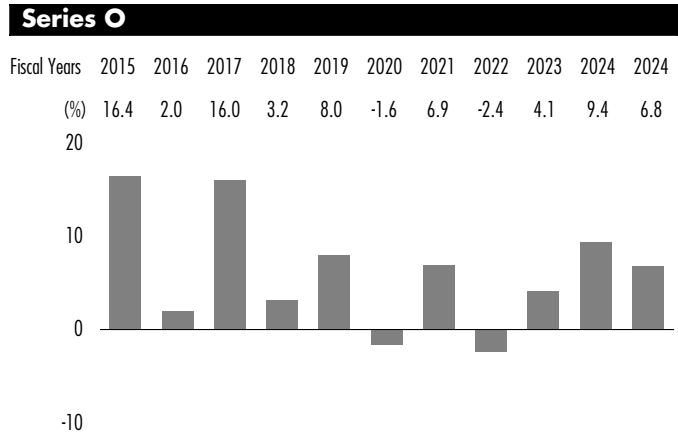
