Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Fidelity Floating Rate High Income Currency Neutral Fund, Series B, returned 2.6%, after fees and expenses, for the six-month period ended September 30, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, U.S. bonds, as represented by the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index - Hedged CAD, returned 4.8% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

U.S. investment-grade bonds, as broadly represented by the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index, returned 5.1% in Canadian dollar terms and 5.3% in U.S. dollar terms, for the six-month period ended September 30, 2024.

U.S. investment-grade bonds advanced in Canadian and U.S. dollar terms over the period under review. High yield bonds continued to outperform their investment-grade peers, benefitting from higher all-in yields and distress levels near long-term averages. Headline inflation fell to 2.5% in August, the lowest level since February 2021. The U.S. Federal Reserve (the Fed) approved its first interest rate cut in four years, lowering the benchmark policy rate by 50 basis points to 4.75-5.0%. The August jobs report was weaker than expected, indicating a softening U.S. labour market. Combined, this caused U.S. Treasury yields to trend lower through the period under review, after peaking in April. Continued geopolitical tensions and uncertainties around the upcoming election continued to weigh on investor sentiment.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the Morningstar LSTA U.S. Leveraged Loan Index - Hedged CAD, returned 3.5% for the review period. The Fund underperformed its benchmark, primarily due to the Underlying Fund's investments in the oil and gas industry and the leisure goods/activities/movies industry. In the oil and gas industry, investments in U.S.-based integrated gas-to-power energy infrastructure company New Fortress Energy, and U.S.-based hydrocarbon exploration company California Resources Corporation, detracted from relative returns. In the leisure goods/activities/movies industry, an investment in U.S.-based media and entertainment company Allen Media Group, and lack of exposure to a U.S.-based movie exhibition company, both detracted from relative returns. In other industries, lack of exposure to a U.S.-based telecommunications company, and an investment in U.S.-based businesses operator Franchise Group, detracted from relative returns.

Conversely, investments in the all telecom industry and the electronics and electrical industry contributed to relative returns. In the all telecom industry, an investment in U.S.-based technology communication company Securus Technologies, and lack of exposure to a Canada-based internet service provider, contributed to relative returns. In the electronics and electrical industry, lack of exposure to U.S.-based software companies contributed to relative returns. In other industries, investments in U.S.-based fabric and crafts retail company Jo-Ann Stores, and U.S.-based electronic device insurance company Asurion, contributed to relative returns.

Portfolio changes:

The Underlying Fund continues to invest across various sectors in the floating rate debt securities market to provide investors with broad market exposure and diversification. The portfolio managers continue to rely on a fundamental research process to identify investment opportunities.

During the review period, the portfolio managers increased the allocations to the aerospace and defense industry, and the oil and gas industry, and decreased the allocations to the all telecom industry, and the health care sector. In terms of credit quality, the portfolio managers continue to find what the managers believe to be attractive opportunities among B-rated securities.

As at September 30, 2024, B-rated issues accounted for the Underlying Fund's largest absolute exposure. In terms of industries, the electronics and electrical industry accounted for the Underlying Fund's largest absolute exposure, followed by the business equipment and services industry.

Derivatives disclosure:

During the period, the Fund engaged in forward foreign currency contracts, in a manner consistent with its investment objectives and strategies, to hedge against the effect of currency fluctuations on the investment returns of the Fund. The use of forward contracts in this manner does not completely eliminate the impact of currency fluctuations on returns and the Fund's returns will differ from the local currency returns of the Underlying Fund's investments.

Recent Developments

Portfolio managers Eric Mollenhauer, Kevin Nielsen and Chandler Perine observed that lower-quality loans continued to outperform higher-quality loans in the third quarter. The managers acknowledged that investment demand from the loan market remains high, especially for collateralized loan obligations. The managers believe that high-end consumer spending continues to rise, playing a crucial role in driving the overall economy. Additionally, the robust labour market, with unemployment at 4.1%, alleviates concerns of a recession in the short or intermediate term. The managers believe that the current 1% default rates are unrealistically low, especially with 3% of issuers currently undergoing liability management exercises. Nonetheless, they believe that falling interest rates in the near future will improve interest coverage ratios and reduce overall leverage for most issuers in their portfolio. The portfolio managers believe this is a good environment in which to use their proprietary research to find opportunities for potential income.

An investor became a holder of more than 10% of the outstanding securities of the Fund in the period ending September 30, 2024.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$92,000 for the period ended September 30, 2024.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$18,000 for the period ended September 30, 2024.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

The net assets attributable to securityholders per security presented in the financial statements may differ from the net asset value calculated for fund pricing purposes. An explanation of these differences can be found in the notes to financial statements.
- ^B Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of securities outstanding at the relevant time. The increase (decrease) from operations is based on the weighted average number of securities outstanding over the financial period. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of beginning to ending net assets per security.
- ^C Distributions were paid in cash or reinvested in additional securities of the Fund, or both, and excludes any applicable distributions of management fee reduction to securityholders. Distributions are presented based on management's best estimate of the tax character.
- ^D This information is provided as at period end of the year shown.
- ^E Prior period amounts may have been adjusted.
- ^F Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding distributions, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset values during the period, including the Fund's pro-rata share of estimated expenses incurred in any underlying investment fund, if applicable.

The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.
- ^J Effective October 1, 2015, the manager of the Fund has waived a portion of its administration fee and as of the date of the MRFP has continued to provide the Fund with such waivers. The manager may terminate the waiver at any time, at its sole discretion. It is not known when such waivers will be terminated.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.

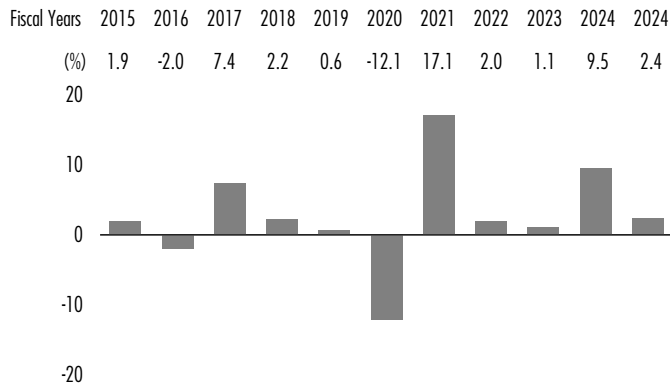
Past Performance

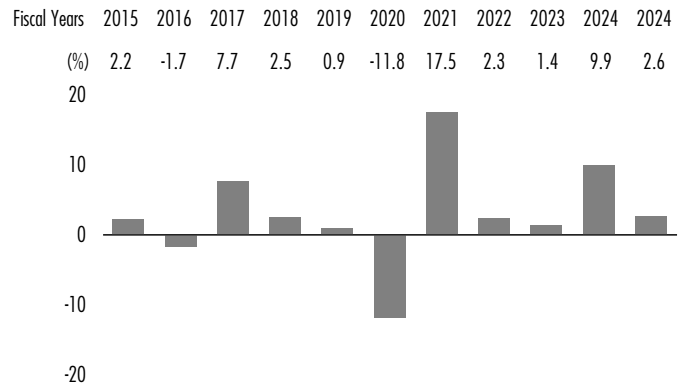
Year-by-Year Returns

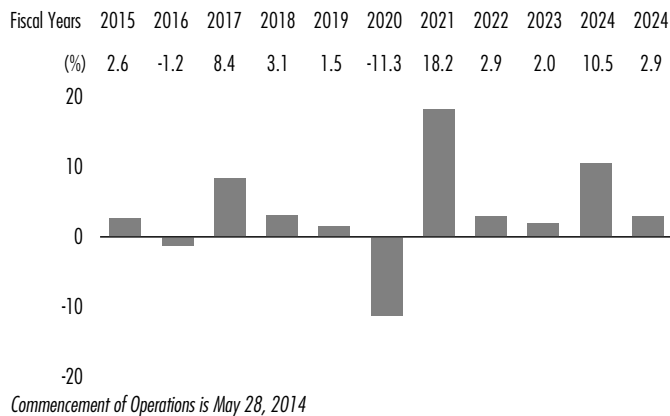
