Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Securities of this Fund are only available for purchase by other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity, and are not available for public purchase.

Fidelity Insights Currency Neutral Multi-Asset Base Fund™, Series 0, returned 10.7%, for the six-month period ended September 30, 2024. During the review period, U.S. equities, as represented by the S&P 500 Index - Hedged CAD, returned 9.8% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

U.S. equities, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, returned 10.2% in Canadian dollar terms and 10.4% in U.S. dollar terms, for the six-month period ended September 30, 2024.

U.S. equities rose over the review period. Despite significant volatility over the period under review, the U.S. equity market finished higher due to a strong economy, positive earnings growth, and expectations of easing inflation. The information technology and communication services sectors were an area of strength early in the review period, but later experienced volatility partly due to investor skepticism regarding the future returns from investments in artificial intelligence. The U.S. Federal Reserve's (the Fed) preferred measure of inflation, the annual core personal consumption expenditures index, fell to 2.7% in August 2024 from 2.8% in April 2024, while the annual consumer-price index eased to 2.5% in August, the lowest since February 2021. The U.S. economy added 159,000 jobs in August, while the unemployment rate increased to 4.2% in August 2024 from 3.9% in April 2024. Against this backdrop, the Fed approved its first interest rate cut in four years in September 2024, reducing the benchmark policy rate by 50 basis points to 4.75–5.0%.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund outperformed its benchmark, the S&P 500 Index - Hedged CAD, primarily due to the Underlying Fund's investments in the communication services sector. In the sector, an investment in U.S.-based technology company Meta Platforms, and a lower-than-benchmark allocation to U.S.-based multinational media and entertainment company Disney, contributed to relative returns. The Underlying Fund's exposure to certain stocks in the industrials sector, such as U.S.-based electric services company GE Vernova, and U.S.-based aircraft engine supplier General Aerospace, also contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, an investment in U.S.-based semiconductors company NVIDIA, and lack of exposure to a U.S.-based multinational technology company, contributed to relative returns.

In contrast, investments in the consumer discretionary and financials sectors detracted from relative returns. In the consumer discretionary sector, a lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based electric vehicle manufacturer Tesla, and an investment in U.S.-based vacation rental company Airbnb, detracted from relative returns. In the financials sector, investments in U.S.-based multinational payment services company VISA, and U.S.-based financial services firm Berkshire Hathaway, also detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based multinational consumer electronics company Apple detracted from relative returns, as did investments in U.S.-based computational software company Cadence Design Systems, and U.S.-based pharmaceutical company Merck & Co.

Portfolio changes:

During the review period, the Underlying Fund's exposure to the financials and communication services sectors was increased. In the financials sector, portfolio manager Will Danoff increased exposure to U.S.-based multinational bank holding company American Express. In the communication services sector, exposure was increased to Meta Platforms due to a change in its stock price.

In contrast, exposure to the energy and materials sectors was decreased. In the energy sector, the portfolio manager exited a position in U.S.-based exploration and production company ConocoPhillips. In the materials sector, exposure was reduced to U.S.-based steel production company Nucor Corporation. The portfolio manager pursued opportunities which the manager believes has better upside investment potential.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the information technology sector, followed by the communication services sector. The Underlying Fund diverged most from its benchmark sector weightings by having more exposure to the communication services sector and less exposure to the information technology sector.

Derivatives disclosure:

During the period, the Fund engaged in forward foreign currency contracts, in a manner consistent with its investment objectives and strategies, to hedge against the effect of currency fluctuations on the investment returns of the Fund. The use of forward contracts in this manner does not completely eliminate the impact of currency fluctuations on returns and the Fund's returns will differ from the local currency returns of the Underlying Fund's investments.

Recent Developments

Portfolio manager Will Danoff's investment strategy focuses on understanding "best of breed" companies with strong long-term business models and competitive advantages that, the manager believes, can achieve sustainable long-term growth leadership. The portfolio manager remains positive on the earnings environment and has leveraged periods of market volatility to increase concentration in the Underlying Fund's active holdings. The manager continues to have a positive outlook on big tech-related companies that are profitable, grow at above-average rates, and operate in large and expanding markets, in the manager's view. The portfolio manager is finding strength in some of the more growth-oriented areas of the

market across a wide variety of sectors, due to attractively valued earnings growth potential, investable secular trends, and a potential peak in interest rates, in the portfolio manager's view.

Fidelity Global Income Portfolio and Fidelity Global Income Class Portfolio became holders of more than 10% of the outstanding securities of the Fund in the period ending September 30, 2024.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund is only offered in Series O securities and is only available to: (i) institutional investors who may be individuals or financial institutions who have been approved by Fidelity and have entered into Series O fund purchase agreements with Fidelity; or (ii) other funds and accounts managed or advised by Fidelity. The Fund does not pay management and advisory fees, or other operating expenses, other than certain specified fund costs, including taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

(i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;

(ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.


[#] The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is nanualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.
