Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Fidelity U.S. All Cap Currency Neutral Class (Fund) invests substantially all of its assets in securities of Fidelity U.S. All Cap Fund (Underlying Fund).

Fidelity U.S. All Cap Currency Neutral Class, Series B, returned 15.0%, after fees and expenses, for the six-month period ended May 31, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, U.S. equities, as represented by the S&P 500 Index - Hedged CAD, returned 15.9% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

U.S. equities, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, returned 17.0% in Canadian dollar terms and 16.4% in U.S. dollar terms, for the six-month period ended May 31, 2024.

U.S. equities rose during the review period. Strong corporate earnings, persistent economic growth, and a potential peak in the interest rate hiking cycles all boosted investor confidence. Select beneficiaries of developments in the artificial intelligence space, mainly within the communication services and information technology sectors, also contributed to gains. However, equity market upside was somewhat limited as investors lowered their expectations of rate-cuts in 2024. This was partly a result of continued strength in the U.S. economy, while inflation, as measured by the U.S. consumer price index, remained persistent at 3.4% in April 2024. The labour market was also strong, with modest signs of softening towards the end of the review period. The U.S. economy created 175,000 new jobs in April (U.S. Nonfarm Payrolls), the smallest increase in six months, while the unemployment rate climbed slightly to 3.9%. Against this backdrop, the U.S. Federal Open Markets Committee held the Federal Funds rate unchanged at 5.25%–5.50% in its May 2024 policy meeting.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the Russell MidCap Value Index - Hedged CAD, returned 13.5% for the review period. The Fund outperformed its benchmark primarily due to the Underlying Fund's exposure to certain stocks in the utilities and energy sectors. In the utilities sector, an investment in U.S.-based energy firm Constellation Energy, and out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based energy firm NextEra Energy, contributed to relative returns. In the energy sector, out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based energy firm Expro Group Holdings, and an investment in U.S.-based oil and natural gas firm Antero Resources, both contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, out-of-benchmark exposure to Singapore-based electronics manufacturing services firm Flex, and U.S.-based health care and insurance firm Cigna Group, contributed to relative returns.

In contrast, investments in, and lower-than-benchmark exposure to, the industrials sector detracted from relative returns. In the sector, an investment in U.S.-based uniforms and workplace supplies provider Vestis, and lack of exposure to a U.S.-based infrastructure and services firm, detracted from relative returns. Investments in certain stocks in the health care sector also detracted from relative returns. In that sector, out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based managed care company Centene Corporation, and to U.S.-based health care and retail pharmacy services firm CVS Health, both detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, investments in U.S.-based financial and payments technology firm Global Payments, and U.S.-based software and services firm NCR Voyix, detracted from relative returns.

Portfolio changes:

During the review period, the Underlying Fund's exposure to the industrials and communication services sectors was increased. In the industrials sector, the portfolio manager initiated a position in U.S.-based electrical distribution and services firm WESCO International. In the communication services sector, a position was initiated in U.S.-based advertising firm Interpublic Group of Companies. The portfolio manager believes these companies offer strong sustainable cash flow outlooks and are valued attractively.

In contrast, exposure to the real estate and financials sectors was decreased. In the real estate sector, the portfolio manager exited a position in U.S.-based real estate services firm Jones Lang Lasalle. In the financials sector, a position was exited in U.S.-based real estate finance and advisory services firm Walker & Dunlop. The portfolio manager chose to invest in other opportunities the portfolio manager believes to have more risk/reward potential.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the industrials sector, followed by the financials sector. The Underlying Fund diverged most from its benchmark's sector weightings by having more exposure to the energy sector, and less exposure to the information technology sector.

Derivatives disclosure:

During the period, the Fund engaged in forward foreign currency contracts, in a manner consistent with its investment objectives and strategies, to hedge against the effect of currency fluctuations on the investment returns of the Fund. The use of forward contracts in this manner does not completely eliminate the impact of currency fluctuations on returns and the Fund's returns will differ from the local currency returns of the Underlying Fund's investments.

Recent Developments

The Underlying Fund's investment objective aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity securities of U.S. companies. Portfolio manager Matt Friedman uses a disciplined approach that is focused on identifying what the manager believes to be high-quality companies trading at a discount. The portfolio manager aims to find the highest-quality companies that are trading at a discount by focusing on those that exhibit high return on equity, good balance sheets, and strong free cash flow-generation. The portfolio manager continues to find what the manager believes to be attractive valuations in the mid-cap U.S. equity space. Those stocks provide opportune entry points for potential long-term capital appreciation.

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$64,000 for the period ended May 31, 2024.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$9,000 for the period ended May 31, 2024.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

- ^C Distributions were paid in cash or reinvested in additional securities of the Fund, or both, and excludes any applicable distributions of management fee reduction to securityholders.

The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.

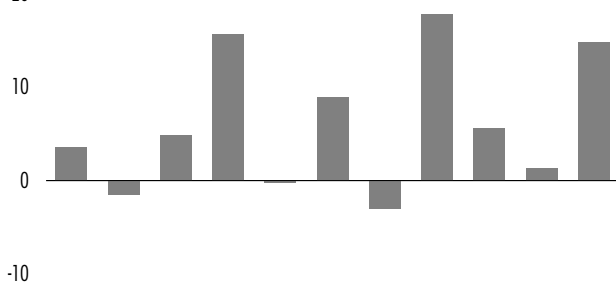

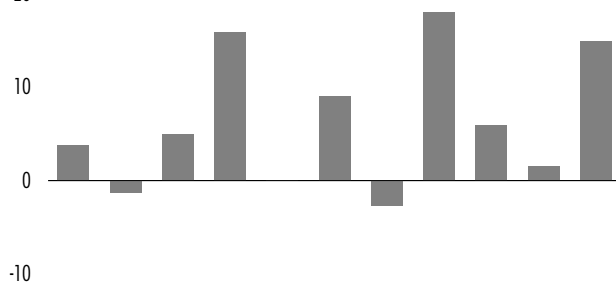

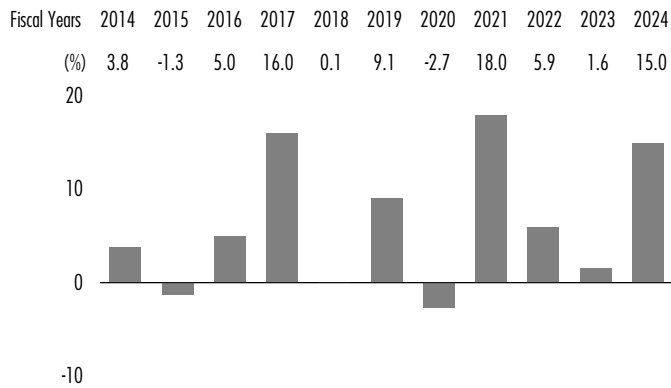
