Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Fidelity International Disciplined Equity® Class (Fund) invests substantially all of its assets in securities of Fidelity International Disciplined Equity® Fund (Underlying Fund).

Fidelity International Disciplined Equity® Class, Series B, returned 16.3%, after fees and expenses, for the six-month period ended May 31, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, global equities, as represented by the MSCI World Index, returned 15.5% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

Global equities, as broadly measured by the MSCI World Index, returned 15.5% in Canadian dollar terms and 14.9% in U.S. dollar terms, for the six-month period ended May 31, 2024.

Global equities advanced during the review period, as resilient economic data and expectations for interest rate cuts, fuelled by decelerating inflation in developed markets, supported expectations for a soft landing in the global economy. Better-than-expected corporate earnings growth further encouraged investor confidence. However, markets were volatile as inflation remained well above the target range of most developed market central banks. Against this global backdrop, U.S., Japan, and Europe ex-U.K. equities rose. In Europe, equities posted robust returns, supported by resilient economic and corporate data as well as a slew of dovish cues from major central banks. Japanese equities also rose, driven primarily by central bank policy expectations, centred on the Bank of Japan and the U.S. Federal Reserve, accompanied by weakness in the Yen. Emerging markets also ended higher but lagged developed markets amid concerns around China's sluggish economic recovery. Investors were concerned about China's growth prospects in the absence of any meaningful stimulus and a suppressed housing market.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the MSCI ACWI (All Country World Index) ex USA Index, returned 11.7% for the review period.

The Fund outperformed its benchmark after fees and expenses, primarily due to the Underlying Fund's exposure to certain stocks in the health care sector. In the sector, Belgium-based pharma company UCB, and Denmark-based pharmaceutical company Novo Nordisk, contributed to relative returns. Certain stocks in the industrials sector, such as Italy-based electrical cable manufacturer Prysmian Group, and Japan-based multinational conglomerate Hitachi, also contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, investments in Taiwan-based semiconductor manufacturer Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company and Spain-based financial services company CaixaBank also contributed to relative returns.

In contrast, the Underlying Fund's investments in certain stocks in the financials sector, including Indonesia-based microfinance company Bank Rakyat, and Hong Kong-based insurance firm AIA Group, detracted from relative returns. In the real estate sector, investments in Belgium-based logistics property developer and investor Warehouses de Pauw, and lack of exposure to an Australia-based commercial property company, also detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, investments in Japan-based air conditioner manufacturer Daikin, and Japan-based multinational conglomerate Sony Corporation, detracted from relative returns.

Portfolio changes:

With respect to sector and regional positioning, the Underlying Fund is managed with a neutral approach, allowing stock selection to be the primary driver of returns. While the Underlying Fund is neutrally positioned at the sector level, subsector industry group allocations may deviate from those of the benchmark.

During the review period, the portfolio manager made positional changes in the Underlying Fund across a range of industries. The portfolio manager increased exposure to the consumer services industry and the capital goods industry. In the consumer services industry, the portfolio manager initiated a position in Ireland-based gambling company Flutter Entertainment, as the portfolio manager believes the company has a dominant market position and is attractively valued. In the capital goods industry, a position was initiated in Japan-based electrical equipment company Fuji Electric because of its solid fundamentals, in the portfolio manager's view.

Conversely, exposure to the automobiles and components industry and the software and services industry was reduced. In the automobiles and components industry, the portfolio manager exited a position in Italy-based car manufacturer Ferrari. In the software and services industry, the portfolio manager reduced exposure to Canada-based e-commerce company Shopify Inc., in view of opportunities with more potential elsewhere, in the portfolio manager's opinion.

In terms of regional exposure, the Underlying Fund's weightings remained mostly in line with the benchmark. Geographic allocations are a by-product of the portfolio manager's bottom-up fundamental stock selection process.

At an industry level, the capital goods industry accounted for the Underlying Fund's largest absolute exposure at the end of the review period. While maintaining sector weightings similar to those of the benchmark, the Underlying Fund diverged most from its benchmark's industry weightings by having more exposure to the capital goods industry and less exposure to the automobiles and components industry.

Recent Developments

Portfolio manager Chris Lee made some minor adjustments to the sector positioning of the Fund, but continued to take a sector-neutral approach to investing in general. According to the portfolio manager, this approach still allows for meaningfully larger- and smaller-than-benchmark allocations at the industry and individual stock levels. The portfolio management team remains consistent in its investment process, which is designed to deliver a cohesive portfolio. The Portfolio manager is working with the team's sector leaders to remain focused on fundamental signals and to identify opportunities he believes could benefit in a post-COVID-19 environment.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$19,000 for the period ended May 31, 2024.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$2,000 for the period ended May 31, 2024.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker:
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.


