#### **Management Discussion of Fund Performance**

#### **Results of Operations**

Fidelity U.S. High Quality ETF Fund, Series B, returned 9.8%, after fees and expenses, for the six-month period ended September 30, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, U.S. equities, as represented by the S&P 500 Index, returned 10.2% (in Canadian dollar terms).

#### Market overview:

U.S. equities, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, returned 10.2% in Canadian dollar terms and 10.4% in U.S. dollar terms, for the six-month period ended September 30, 2024.

U.S. equities rose over the review period. Despite significant volatility over the period under review, the U.S. equity market finished higher due to a strong economy, positive earnings growth, and expectations of easing inflation. The information technology and communication services sectors were an area of strength early in the review period, but later experienced volatility partly due to investor skepticism regarding the future returns from investments in artificial intelligence. The U.S. Federal Reserve's (the Fed) preferred measure of inflation, the annual core personal consumption expenditures index, fell to 2.7% in August 2024 from 2.8% in April 2024, while the annual consumer-price index eased to 2.5% in August, the lowest since February 2021. The U.S. economy added 159,000 jobs in August, while the unemployment rate increased to 4.2% in August 2024 from 3.9% in April 2024. Against this backdrop, the Fed approved its first interest rate cut in four years in September 2024, reducing the benchmark policy rate by 50 basis points to 4.75—5.0%.

#### Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the Fidelity Canada U.S. High Quality Index, returned 10.8% during the review period. The Fund underperformed its benchmark over the period under review. The primary reason for the difference in returns between the Fund and the Index was that the total return of the Fund was reduced by the management fee paid or payable by the Underlying Fund, as well as brokerage and commission costs incurred in acquiring and rebalancing the portfolio of securities held by the Underlying Fund, and taxes (including withholding taxes) and other expenses paid or payable by the Underlying Fund. These fees and expenses are not included in the calculation of the performance of the Index.

The Underlying Fund's exposure to U.S.-based technology hardware and equipment company Apple, U.S.-based semiconductors and semiconductor equipment company NVIDIA and U.S.-based energy company Texas Pacific Land Corporation contributed to total returns, while exposure to U.S.-based energy company ConocoPhillips Company, U.S.-based consumer services company Airbnb and U.S.-based restaurant chain company Domino's Pizza detracted from total returns.

#### Portfolio changes:

At the sector level, relative to the S&P 500 Index, the Underlying Fund had its highest relative weightings in the industrials, energy and consumer discretionary sectors, and its lowest relative weightings in the communication services, health care and financials sectors.

The Index is rebalanced on a semi-annual basis on the third Friday of February and August using data as at the close of business on the day that is ten business days prior to the scheduled rebalancing. Accordingly, the composition of the Fund may change, resulting in different sector and security weightings.

#### Derivatives disclosure:

During the period, the Underlying Fund engaged in futures contracts, in a manner consistent with its investment objective and strategies, to manage the Underlying Fund's cash balance while the portfolio management team sought out other investment opportunities.

#### **Recent Developments**

Since the investment objective of the Underlying Fund is to seek to replicate, to the extent possible and before fees and expenses, the performance of the Index, the Underlying Fund is not actively managed by traditional methods. Accordingly, the Underlying Fund will continue to be invested in securities as described in its investment objective and strategies and will generally not be affected by market developments unless the constituent securities included in the Index change in response to those developments.

#### **Related Party Transactions**

#### Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$224,000 for the period ended September 30, 2024.

## Fidelity U.S. High Quality ETF Fund Management Discussion of Fund Performance – continued

#### **Administration Fee**

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$67,000 for the period ended September 30, 2024.

#### **Brokerage Commissions**

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non—affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution—only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity Investments were \$0 for the period ended September 30, 2024. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution of transactions with affiliates, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity Investments, at least once per year.

#### Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

#### **Independent Review Committee**

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

#### **Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions**

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

The net assets attributable to securityholders per security presented in the financial statements may differ from the net asset value calculated for fund pricing purposes. - B Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of securities outstanding at the relevant time. The increase (decrease) from operations is based on the weighted average number of securities outstanding over the financial period. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of beginning to ending net assets per security.
- C Distributions were paid in cash or reinvested in additional securities of the Fund, or both, and excludes any applicable distributions of management fee reduction to securityholders. Distributions are presented based on management's best estimate of the tax character.
- <sup>D</sup> This information is provided as at period end of the year shown.
- Prior period amounts may have been adjusted.
- Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding distributions, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset values during the period, including the Fund's pro-rata share of estimated expenses incurred in any underlying investment fund, if applicable, (2024: .39%, 2024: .39%, 2023: .39%, 2022: .39%, 2020: .39%).
- Effective January 28, 2019, the manager of the Fund has waived a portion of its administration fee and as of the date of the MRFP has continued to provide the Fund with such waivers. The manager may terminate the waiver at any time, at its sole discretion. It is not known when such waivers will be terminated.
- The trading expense ratio represents total commissions, other portfolio transaction costs and dividends and interest expense on securities sold short expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period, including the Fund's pro-rata share of estimated trading costs incurred in any underlying investment fund, if applicable.
- The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

#### **Management and Advisory Fees**

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.




## Fidelity U.S. High Quality ETF Fund Past Performance

#### **Year-by-Year Returns**


