Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Fidelity Disruptors[™] Class, Series B, returned 12.7%, after fees and expenses, for the six-month period ended May 31, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, global equities, as represented by the MSCI All Country World Index, returned 14.7% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

Global equities, as broadly measured by the MSCI All Country World Index, returned 14.7% in Canadian dollar terms and 14.1% in U.S. dollar terms, for the six-month period ended May 31, 2024.

Global equities advanced during the review period, as resilient economic data and expectations for interest rate cuts, fuelled by decelerating inflation in developed markets, supported expectations for a soft landing in the global economy. Better-than-expected corporate earnings growth further encouraged investor confidence. However, markets were volatile as inflation remained well above the target range of most developed market central banks. Against this global backdrop, U.S., Japan, and Europe ex-U.K. equities rose. In Europe, equities posted robust returns, supported by resilient economic and corporate data as well as a slew of dovish cues from major central banks. Japanese equities also rose, driven primarily by central bank policy expectations, centred on the Bank of Japan and the U.S. Federal Reserve, accompanied by weakness in the Yen. Emerging markets also ended higher but lagged developed markets amid concerns around China's sluggish economic recovery. Investors were concerned about China's growth prospects in the absence of any meaningful stimulus and a suppressed housing market.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund underperformed its benchmark, the MSCI All Country World Index, for the review period. The Fund's investments in certain stocks in the industrials sector, such as China-based transmission firm Leader Harmonious Drive Systems and China-based mechanical equipment firm Estun Automation, detracted from relative returns. Investments in the financials sector, including Uruguay-based payment solutions provider dLocal and U.S.-based foreign exchange firm Flywire, also detracted from relative returns.

In contrast, investments in, and higher-than-benchmark exposure to, the information technology sector contributed to relative returns, and in particular investments in U.S.-based semiconductor firm NVIDIA and Taiwan-based semiconductor firm Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing. A higher-than-benchmark exposure to, and investments in, the communication services sector, also contributed to relative returns, particularly investments in Singapore-based internet firm Sea Limited and U.S.-based social technology firm Meta Platforms.

Portfolio changes:

During the review period, the Fund's exposure to the information technology and health care sectors increased. In the information technology sector, a position was initiated in U.S.-based semiconductor firm ON Semiconductor. In the health care sector, a position was initiated in U.S.-based medical technology firm Edwards Lifesciences. The portfolio management team believes that these companies have good investment growth potential.

In contrast, exposure to the industrials and financials sectors declined. In the industrials sector, exposure to Japan-based industrial automation solutions provider FANUC was reduced. In the financials sector, exposure to Uruguay-based payment solutions provider dLocal was reduced.

At the end of the review period, the Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the information technology sector, followed by the health care sector. The Fund diverged the most from the benchmark sector weightings by having more exposure to the health care sector and less exposure to the consumer staples sector.

Recent Developments

The portfolio management team believes disruptive companies have the potential to disrupt or displace incumbents over time. They expect that this may shape what the market looks like for years to come, by responding to advances in technology, emerging industries and changing consumer preferences. The portfolio management team seeks to identify these disruptive opportunities by sourcing ideas and insights from across Fidelity's global research platform. The portfolio management team believes that such strategies allow investors to remain focused on an underlying driver of value and to invest in companies with the potential to offer long-term capital appreciation.

Effective February 12, 2024, Niamh Brodie-Machura ceased to be a Portfolio Manager.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity has entered into sub-advisory agreements with a number of entities including Fidelity Management & Research Company LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. The sub-advisors arrange for acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$123,000 for the period ended May 31, 2024.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$15,000 for the period ended May 31, 2024.

Brokerage Commissions

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity Investments were less than \$500 for the period ended May 31, 2024. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution of transactions with affiliates, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity Investments, at least once per year.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

(i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;

(ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

- The trading expense ratio represents total commissions, other portfolio transaction costs and dividends and interest expense on securities sold short expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period, including the Fund's pro-rata share of estimated trading costs incurred in any underlying investment fund, if applicable.
- ¹ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.




Fidelity Disruptors® Class of the Fidelity Capital Structure Corp. **Past Performance**


Year-by-Year Returns




Commencement of Operations is September 28, 2021






Commencement of Operations is September 28, 2021
